THE PROBLEM

Alabama funds programs to review infant deaths, but does not fund a program to review maternal deaths. While a state maternal mortality review committee was created in 2018, it currently has no funding. As a result, there is a significant backlog of unreviewed maternal deaths.

THE SOLUTION

Alabama must provide sufficient funding for the MMRC to review maternal deaths, just as all of Alabama's neighboring states have already done. Why? A funded MMRC has helped states decrease their maternal death rate, with some having decreased by more than 50%.



ROLE OF THE MMRC

The Maternal Mortality Review Committee (MMRC) is a collaboration of agencies and professionals working to better understand factors causing maternal deaths and identify the strengths and weaknesses of current programs and services.

The overall purpose of the MMRC is to:

- Conduct reviews of each maternal death
- Create actionable prevention strategies
- Implement positive changes in health systems
- Reduce maternal mortality and complications
- Improve health for women, infants, and families



WHY FUND THE MMRC?
