FDA Informs Public About Possible Accuracy Concerns with Abbott ID NOW Point-of-Care Test

On Thursday, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) issued an alert warning that Abbott Laboratories' rapid COVID-19 tests may deliver false negative results. The alert comes after multiple studies have raised questions about the test's accuracy. FDA said the test can still be used, but negative results may need to be confirmed with a separate molecular test.

Serological Testing for SARS-CoV-2 Antibodies

The American Medical Association (AMA) issued guidance (<u>linked here</u>) to help physicians and the public understand potential uses and limitations of antibody testing, and warn against determining immunity or discontinuing physical distancing based on antibody testing.

Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loan Forgiveness Application



On Friday, May 15, 2020, the Small Business Administration (SBA), in consultation with the Department of the Treasury, released the Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) Loan Forgiveness Application and detailed instructions for the application.


The form and instructions inform borrowers how to apply for forgiveness of their PPP loans, consistent with the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES Act). The SBA claims they will also soon issue regulations and guidance to further assist borrowers as they complete their applications, and to provide lenders with guidance on their responsibilities.

The form and instructions include several measures to reduce compliance burdens and simplify the process for borrowers, including:

- Options for borrowers to calculate payroll costs using an "alternative payroll covered period" that aligns with borrowers' regular payroll cycles.
- Flexibility to include eligible payroll and non-payroll expenses paid or incurred during the eightweek period after receiving their PPP loan.
- Step-by-step instructions on how to perform the calculations required by the CARES Act to confirm eligibility for loan forgiveness.
- Borrower-friendly implementation of statutory exemptions from loan forgiveness reduction based on rehiring by June 30.
- Addition of a new exemption from the loan forgiveness reduction for borrowers who have made
 a good-faith, written offer to rehire workers that was declined.
