Today, Gov. Ivey issued an order protecting physicians, their staff, and their practices from lawsuits related to COVID-19. The governor's order, the eighth such supplemental emergency order issued by her administration since the pandemic began, provides a "safe harbor" for services affected by COVID-19 or Alabama's response to the pandemic and from other COVID-19 related claims.

Safer at Home Order Amended

AMENDED SAFER AT HOME Goes into effect on May 11th

The safer at home order that closed restaurants and bars, gyms, salons and churches in Alabama will end Monday, May 11. Governor Kay Ivey announced the changes to the safer at home order during today's press conference. The new order will remain in place until May 22. Important Alabama Medicaid Update

The Medical Association of the State of Alabama along with the Alabama Chapter-AAP and the AAFP, had previously requested relief from Medicaid on a number of issues related to the COVID-19 crisis. Pursuant to our requests for changes in Medicaid policy, the Medicaid commissioner has responded with the attached letter. In her letter, Medicaid has agreed with the Medical Association to provide physicians a number of beneficial policy changes including additional payments for telehealth visits, wellness visits, and nursing triage care.
