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COVID-19 Grant Program

Closes Tomorrow



Due in part to the advocacy efforts of our Association, Governor Ivey has awarded \$35 million in Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act (CARES Act) funds to establish the Alabama Health Care and Emergency Response Providers grant program. The grants will support providers who have been financially impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

On a first-come-first serve basis, the state of Alabama will offer cash grants in an amount up to \$15,000 for Alabama health care and emergency response providers that meet eligibility requirements. **The application period for the Alabama Health Care and Emergency Response Provider grant program closes tomorrow at noon.**

Major Changes to 2021 E/M Coding

MAJOR CHANGES COMING TO 2021 E/M CODING!

Considerable changes are being made to Medicare outpatient evaluation and management (E/M) codes. The transition will take effect on January 1, 2021 and will likely affect physicians across all specialties.

The changes are currently restricted to new and established outpatient visits (CPT codes 99202-99205, 99211-99215) and will impact everyone who assigns codes, manages patient information, or pays claims including physicians, health information managers, coders, payers, health systems, and hospitals.

Open Enrollement



The Physicians Insurance Plan of Alabama through Blue Cross Blue Shield is available for members of the Medical Association. PIPA provides you, your family, and your staff with strong benefits at affordable premiums as compared to other options. We worked with Blue Cross to keep the rate increase to a minimum. While many groups are experiencing a double digit increase, ours is only a 2% increase. Dental coverage has increased by 4 percent.

Qualified members may sign up for PIPA when full Regular Member dues are paid. PIPA does not require all participants in your office be on the same plan. Open enrollment for PIPA is Oct. 1 -Nov. 16, 2020 for a Jan. 1, 2021, effective date. If you are currently enrolled in PIPA, you do not have to reapply. However, if you or your staff wish to make changes to your current plan, please do so no later than Nov. 16, 2020.
