2022 Primary Election Voter Guide

State and federal law states an employer can distribute information about a candidate and solicit employees' support for that candidate as long as the employer does not practice job discrimination, financial reprisal or coercive threats of any kind with regard to the employees' right to vote.

REGISTER TO VOTE. The deadline to register is Monday, May 9. Visit the Secretary of State's Register to Vote/ Update Your Information website, <https://sos.alabama.gov/alabama-votes/voter/register-to-vote>, or scan the QR code to the right for details.



(OR) VOTE ABSENTEE. If you or your employees work shifts of 10 hours or more that coincide with polling hours, or if you or your employees will be traveling on Election Day, you may be able to vote absentee. The deadline to apply for an absentee ballot is Tuesday, May 17. Visit the Secretary of State's Absentee Voting Information website, <http://www.sos.alabama.gov/alabama-votes/voter/absentee-voting>, or scan the QR code to the right for details.



GIVE YOUR EMPLOYEES TIME OFF TO VOTE. Under Alabama law, employees must be given up to an hour off of your choosing to vote unless the employee works a shift that begins at least two hours after the opening of the polls or ends at least one hour before polls close.

Polling hours in Alabama are 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Encourage your employees to vote before or after they come to work or give them the required time off to vote if their shift conflicts with polling hours. Remind them they will need to present a valid photo ID, such as a driver's license, to vote.
